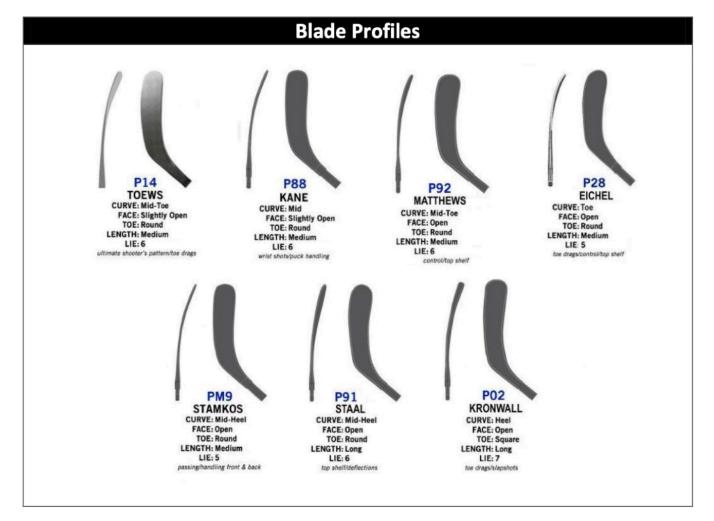

Ordering Tips & Info

Below are some general tips to help with the stick customization. While every player has their **personal preferences**, these are some good starting points:

Flex: The general rule is half of the player's body weight but keep in mind if a stick will become stiffer if it is cut down to fit the player. For example, if a player is 5'8" and 160 lbs. an INT 65 or 70 flex would end up closer to 80 once it is cut down to fit the player. Many higher level players (especially forwards) are choosing even lower flex shafts to improve wrist and snap shots. Defence sometimes prefer a slightly stiffer shaft for slap shots from the point.

Length: The general rule is when standing a stick straight up in front of the player, the top of the shaft should be at the chin when wearing skates or the tip of the player's nose when wearing socks. Defence tend to prefer a slightly longer stick for stick checks while forwards sometimes choose slightly shorter lengths for handling the puck in tight spaces.
